### A magpie's life:

**A scoop on the swooper reveals complexity and intelligence in the often maligned bird.**

It is the end of a hard day for a bloke in his prime in suburban Logan. After making sure everyone has had enough to eat, finishing off a rowdy fight with some pesky neighbours and giving the wife just enough attention to keep her happy -it is finally time to relax. Ah, the choices: play with the kids, drop in at a barbecue down the street or simply find a quiet corner in the backyard and belt out a few songs.

The fellow in question is not a human but one of the nation's most famous birds - the ubiquitous, beautiful, sometimes maligned, yet mostly loved magpie. Magpies lead much more complicated lives than we ever thought.



Magpies may have capabilities comparable to a dog's, or perhaps even a primate's, and are at least as smart as the raven - another bird whose mind becomes more impressive the closer

researchers look. Magpies are certainly outstanding communicators and they keep surprising us with their ability to solve problems, suggesting a cognitive framework that is probably in the higher domain.

The more we study them, the more likely it seems magpies even have a rudimentary vocabulary allowing them to distinguish between a ground and an air predator. They have incredible ability, flexibility and range in the sheer number of songs and calls they can make - there are at least seven or eight different alarm calls alone.

Along with their distinctive appearance and cheeky nature, magpies are most famous for their calls, especially their carolling which has been measured at up to 127 decibels - similar in noise to a motorbike at full pelt.

Carolling is the magpie's answer to almost every property dispute. It is so potent that scientific studies have shown that playing a recording of a dominant magpie's song - after the magpie has been removed - is enough to enforce its territory. However, the

quiet warbling sometimes practised by an individual probably has no significance in terms of breeding or territory protection. It may actually be not unlike a human humming a tune.

Another trait setting them apart from most other Australian birds is their playfulness. Play is normally associated with mammals to hone their skills that they need later for survival. Magpies are regularly observed on their backs during play, behaviour also found as submission in subordinate adults. They roll around, breast bump each other, pull on wings, run after each other, hide, crouch, engage each other with legs, play fight, peck, grasp, jump and even play hide-and-seek.

In one other respect, magpies show behaviours we recognise: young birds are forbidden from carolling and warbling when the adults are around.

They seem to have an adage that kids should be seen and not heard.

**Living with us.** Some Australian Magpies can be very aggressive during breeding season and attacks on humans and pets can occur.

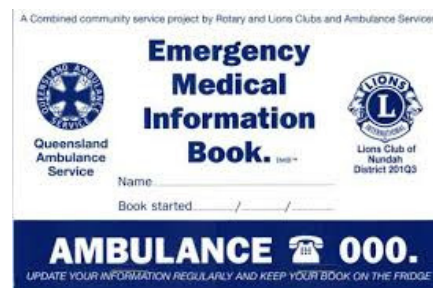

The **'Emergency Medical Information Book'** contains all your information and medical records which are needed if or when an ambulance is called, and you need to be transported to a hospital. When paramedics are called, a typical scenario is that distraught family members may be unable to give correct details of the patient's condition, or the medication they may be on. The paramedics physically have to collect all the patients medication in the house, try and obtain a medical history and take it to the hospital with the patient. This small book contains patient contacts, service or carer provider information, medications and any medical condition, so a paramedic is able to treat and ready a patient for transport to a hospital.

#### **Who should have one of these books?**

All people, adults and children who 'take medications or have a medical condition' should have a book, especially elderly people living on their own.

Each book has a clear plastic sleeve with strip magnets and is placed on the fridge door once it has been filled out by the owner (patient) together with their doctor.
