We will need items for the trailer so ask around see what we can come up with.



Overheard at the Bar:

HISTORY- Another interesting fact from our Editor.

WRISTWATCHES: They were originally designed for women; men who wore them were considered sissies. The first wristwatch was made for Countess Koscowicz of Hungary by the Swiss watch manufacturer Patek Philippe in **1868**. It wasn't until the end of World War 1 – for them to be acceptable men's wear.

On July 9, 1916, *The New York Times* puzzled over a fashion trend: Europeans were starting to wear bracelets with clocks on them. Time had migrated to the human wrist, and the development required some explaining. "Until recently," the paper observed, "the bracelet watch has been looked upon by Americans as more or less of a joke. Vaudeville artists and moving-picture actors have utilized it as a funmaker, as a 'silly ass' fad."



But the wristwatch was a "silly-ass fad" no more. "The telephone and signal service, which play important parts in modern warfare, have made the wearing of watches by soldiers obligatory," the *Times* observed, two years into World War I. "The only practical way in which they can wear them is on the wrist, where the time can be ascertained readily, an impossibility with the old style pocket watch." Improvements in communications technologies had enabled militaries to more precisely coordinate their maneuvers, and coordination required soldiers to discern the time at a glance. Rifling through your pocket for a watch was not advisable in

the chaos of the trenches.

European soldiers were outfitting the device with **unbreakable glass** to survive the trenches and **radium** to illuminate the display at night. And civilians, seeing the wristwatch's practical benefits over the pocket watch, were parroting the behavior.

The Lions *Children of Courage Awards* are now established as an important and extremely worthwhile project of Lions International in Australia.

There are four (4) categories for which a child may be nominated and they are...

- *Special needs...Children with special need i.e. sight, hearing, speech impaired, wheelchair bound or long periods of hospitalization or medical treatments.*
- *Courageous act or deed...Showing great concern for others, aided at an accident, instrumental in the preservation of life or property. This category may also include children who have undergone lifesaving operations, undergone daily medical treatments i.e. diabetes, or care for parents with a disability.*
- *Inspiring sporting achievement...Children who have overcome great personal hardship/disadvantages to achieve a high degree of sporting prowess either as an individual or team, member.*
- *Sibling recognition... siblings who actively participate in the daily care for their brother or sister who have either a physical or intellectual disability.*

All children just want to be accepted by others regardless of any special needs they may have. These awards will portray them as children who have successfully overcome additional barriers, which face them in this world. As each child is called forward for the presentation, a short summary of the reasons for the presentation and eligibility for the award is read out. The recipient of the award then receives a medallion and a certificate.

Nominations are restricted to children between the ages of five (5) and fifteen (15) years at close of nominations.
